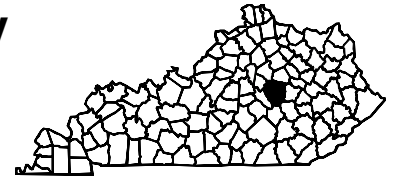

**Admission requirements:** ACT and/or SAT. Graduate of an accredited high school or pass GED. For admission without developmental requirements, students must equal or exceed all of the following ACT scores: English, 18; Mathematics, 19; Reading 18; Composite, 18. Accumulated GPA of 2.0 for all first-time freshmen and transfer students.

**Criteria used to determine nontraditional status:** Age 25 or older

**Placement/credit examinations:** ACT, AP, CLEP, institutional tests, National League for Nursing (NLN)

**Application deadlines:** Fall: August 1  
Spring: December 15

**Pre-enrollment fees and deposits:**
