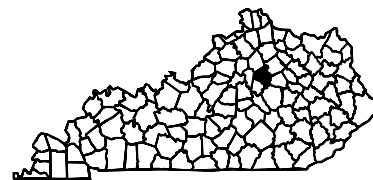

Admission requirements: ACT or SAT. Admission based on high school grades, standardized test scores and additional information. Precollege curriculum required for incoming freshmen.

Criteria used to determine nontraditional status: Age 25 or older or two years out of high school, military veteran, or family responsibilities

Placement/credit examinations: AP, CLEP, institutional test, International Baccalaureate

Application deadlines: Fall: February 15
Spring: October 15
Summer: Contact Admissions

The admission application deadline for students applying for academic scholarship consideration is January 15.
