The following pages provide information about costs, admissions, financial aid and majors at Kentucky colleges. **In addition to the tuition and fees and the room and board costs shown, there are other costs associated with college: books, supplies, transportation and personal costs.** Some schools that don't have on-campus housing have provided figures showing the housing cost they use in figuring the cost of attendance.

Information in this chapter will almost certainly change before you start college. For the most up-to-date information, contact the school you plan to attend.

Included in this section of this chapter is information about Kentucky four-year and two-year degree-granting colleges and universities. Four-year, degree-granting schools offer bachelor's degrees, and many offer advanced degrees as well. Two-year, degree-granting schools offer associate degrees, and many also offer certificates and diplomas. The final section has information about trade schools whose programs lead to diplomas or certificates rather than two- or four-year degrees.

The agencies below license these kinds of trade schools in Kentucky and can be contacted for more information about the training programs listed in this section as well as those of other trade schools not included in *Getting In*.
