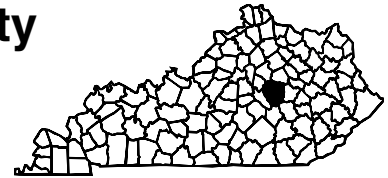

Admission requirements: ACT and/or SAT. Graduate of an accredited high school or pass GED. For admission without developmental requirements, students must equal or exceed all of the following ACT scores: English, 18; Mathematics, 19; Reading 18; Composite, 18. Accumulated GPA of 2.0 for all first-time freshmen and transfer students.
