Mary Jo Young Scholarship

High School Scholarship
for Dual Credit and
Advanced Placement[®] Courses

Kentucky's trusted source for grants, scholarships and loans.

What is the Mary Jo Young Scholarship?

It's a great opportunity to get a headstart on college while you're in high school. The scholarship is for students in grades 9-12 who likely would not take dual credit or Advanced Placement® (AP) courses without payment of their costs by the scholarship. **Online AP courses** are delivered through the **Kentucky Virtual High School**, while **dual credit courses** may be taken online or onsite.

Why should I be interested?

By taking a course now, you can:

- ❑ Find out what it takes to succeed at the college level.
- ❑ Be better prepared when you enter a college or university full-time.
- ❑ Save on college tuition, which makes college more affordable.
- ❑ Earn credit hours toward your high school diploma and college degree at the same time.

How much is the Scholarship?

- ❑ \$575 for two content-semester courses.
- ❑ \$350 for one content-semester courses.



The award covers tuition, materials, test preparation, and the exam fee (if applicable) for AP® and dual credit courses. You can apply for awards for more than one course in a single school year.

How do I qualify?

First, you must show you're interested in going to college. What are your career goals? What's in your individual graduation plan? Could you get the recommendation of school officials or community sponsors?

To get started, **contact your high school guidance counselor**. The counselor will determine whether you may qualify.



To be eligible, you must:

- ❑ Be a high school freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior and a legal resident of Kentucky.
- ❑ Be enrolled in a certified school.
- ❑ Have passed prerequisite courses or demonstrate competency in prerequisite content.
- ❑ Have verification of status submitted by a school official to the Kentucky Department of Education.
- ❑ Be (including, but not limited to) a low-income or minority student or have a disability.
- ❑ For dual credit courses:
 - ❖ Be enrolled in a Kentucky college or university before the mid-term of the course.
 - ❖ Be enrolled in credit-bearing courses as defined by Council on Postsecondary Education criteria for college placement in credit-bearing coursework (visit www.cpe.ky.gov or see your guidance counselor).
- ❑ For AP® courses:
 - ❖ Agree to take the AP® exam.
