Four-year colleges in Kentucky may require you to take the ACT or SAT entrance exam. If you've been out of school for several years, you may not have to take any entrance exam, depending on the school you've chosen to attend. 
#### **Entrance/Placement Tests**


The **ACT** is required or accepted at all public and private colleges in Kentucky. It has multiple-choice questions in English, math, reading and science reasoning, plus an optional writing test. For more information or to register online, visit www.act.org or www.actstudent.org.

The **SAT** has two sections: math and evidence-based reading and writing. For more information or to register online, visit https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat.

The **Graduate Management Admission Test**<sup>®</sup> (**GMAT**<sup>®</sup>) is often required for admission to a graduate school of business or management. The GMAT measures mathematical, verbal, reading, writing and reasoning skills. For more information, visit www.mba.com.

Graduate Record Examinations® (GRE®) evaluate students' potential for success in graduate, business or law school. The General Test measures verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, analytical writing and critical thinking skills. The Subject Tests measure undergraduate achievement in specific fields. #### **Tests for College Credit**

The College-Level Examination Program<sup>®</sup> (CLEP<sup>®</sup>), which offers tests for many subjects taken during the first two years of college, lets you receive credit for or get out of taking undergraduate courses. Visit https://clep.collegeboard.org/ for more information.

KCTCS students majoring in a technical field of study can opt out of certain courses by taking a **Challenge Exam** or **Special Technical Education Proficiency** (STEP) Exam. These allow you to demonstrate mastery of course content and receive credit toward your program requirements. Meet with your faculty advisor to discuss the availability of an exam for a specific course. You may take an exam only once per course and may test out of up to 9 semester hours.



Your ACT or SAT composite score can earn you a Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) award of up to \$500 per school year. See pages 27–28 for eligibility requirements, award amounts and other KEES information.
