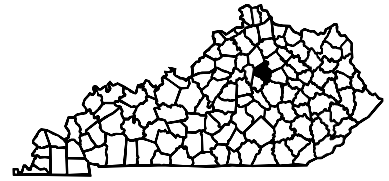

**Admission requirements:** Based on high school grades, ACT/SAT scores and additional information. Precollege curriculum required for incoming freshmen.

**Criteria used to determine nontraditional status:** Age 25 or older or two years out of high school, military veteran, or family responsibilities

**Placement/credit examinations:** AP, CLEP, institutional test, IB

**Application deadlines:** Early Action: December 1  
Regular: February 15

Students need to apply by December 1 if they want to be considered for scholarships or the Honors Program.

**Pre-enrollment fees and deposits:**  
Application for admission: \$50 (nonrefundable)  
Enrollment deposit: \$250, must be paid by May 1 (half goes to prepaid tuition, half goes to orientation fee)  
Housing application: \$50 (nonrefundable)  
Housing deposit: \$150 (prepaid, nonrefundable)
