## Student Financial Aid Data Report 2004-05 through 2008-09 Academic Years

### Introduction

The Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA), created in 1966, has administered student aid programs to help Kentuckians pay their higher education expenses throughout its 43-year history. This edition of the Student Financial Aid Data Book focuses on KHEAA-administered student financial aid programs for Kentucky residents attending postsecondary schools for a five-year period from 2004-05 through 2008-09.

Detailed data is included in this report for the following programs:

- College Access Program (CAP) Grant
- Kentucky Tuition Grant (KTG)
- Teacher Scholarship (TS)
- Osteopathic Medicine Scholarship (OMS)
- Minority Educator Recruitment and Retention (MERR) Scholarship
- Early Childhood Development Scholarship (ECDS)
- Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship (BYRD)
- Go Higher Grant (GHG)

The number of recipients, award amounts, and total amounts for each of the above programs, except GHG for which County and Area Development District (ADD) data are not available, are presented by:

Detailed data at the individual student-level for the following programs is not available in KHEAA's student aid system databases; therefore, only aggregate data is presented for the following programs:

- Kentucky National Guard Tuition Award Program (KNGTAP)
- KHEAA Work-Study Program (KWSP)

Many of Kentucky's student financial aid programs have undergone significant statutory, regulatory, and financial changes throughout the course of their existence. When the General Assembly, in 1998, created the Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) funded by 45% of net Kentucky Lottery proceeds, it simultaneously dedicated 55% of net Lottery proceeds to fund the state's major need-based grant programs, the College Access Program and the Kentucky Tuition Grant Program.

This report does not include data on the Federal Family Education Loan Program (FFELP); the KHEAA-administered Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES), which is detailed in a separate data book; federal need-based grants; campus-based aid; or aid from private sources. In addition, this report does not include disbursements from the Kentucky Education Savings Plan Trust or Kentucky's Affordable Prepaid Tuition Plan, which are derived from participant contributions and earnings.

## College Access Program (CAP) Grant

**Year of Implementation:** 1990-91. The State Student Incentive Grant merged into CAP in 1992-93.

**Program Description:** The College Access Program (CAP) Grant helps Kentucky's financially needy undergraduate students attend Kentucky public and private colleges and universities, proprietary schools, and community and technical colleges. CAP Grants are awarded to Kentucky residents enrolled for at least six semester hours (half-time) in academic programs of at least two years duration.

To apply, students must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). CAP eligibility is determined by the total expected family contribution (EFC), calculated from information on the FAFSA according to the federally mandated formula.

Grants are offered to eligible students until all allocated funds are expended.

**Award Amount:** The maximum award for the 2008-2009 academic year was \$1,900 (\$950 per semester). Eligible part-time college students received an amount calculated on \$79 per credit hour or \$53 per quarter hour. The maximum annual CAP awards for the last five years are listed to the right.

## Kentucky Tuition Grant (KTG)

**Year of Implementation:** 1971-72

**Program Description:** The Kentucky Tuition Grant (KTG) provides need-based grants to qualified Kentucky residents for full-time attendance at the Commonwealth's independent (private or proprietary) colleges and universities. Eligible institutions must be accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (or an equivalent regional accrediting association) and not be comprised solely of religious instruction. The program is designed to assist students with the higher tuition charges at the independent colleges.

To apply, students must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). KTG eligibility is determined by subtracting the expected Pell Grant amount, the expected CAP Grant amount, and the expected family contribution (EFC) from the total cost of education.

Grants are offered to eligible students until all allocated funds are expended.

**Award Amount:** KTG awards may range from \$200 to \$3,000 per academic year. The maximum annual KTG award amounts for the last five years are listed below.

## Teacher Scholarship (TS)

**Year of Implementation:** 1985-1986. The Math/Science Incentive Loan merged into the Teacher Scholarship in the 2002-03 academic year.

**Program Description:** The Teacher Scholarship provides financial assistance in the form of a conversion scholarship/loan to highly qualified, financially needy Kentucky students who are pursuing initial teacher certification at participating institutions.

Recipients are required to teach one semester at a certified Kentucky elementary or secondary school for each semester of award received. Those who teach in a critical subject area receive two semesters credit for each semester of teaching service. Recipients who do not complete an eligible program of study or do not render qualified teaching service must repay the scholarship with 6 percent interest that accrues from the date of disbursement.

To apply, students must complete an online Teacher Scholarship application through Zip Access and a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

**Award Amount:** Juniors, seniors, postbaccalaureate, and graduate students may receive up to \$6,250 per academic year (up to \$2,500 for the fall semester, \$2,500 for the spring semester, and \$1,250 for a summer term). If funds remain, freshman and sophomores may receive an annual maximum of \$1,575 per academic year (up to \$625 for the fall, \$625 for the spring semester, and \$325 for a summer term). The aggregate amount an undergraduate student may receive is \$12,500; a graduate student may receive an additional \$7,500.

**Total Amount Disbursed:** \$11 million to 2,017 students from 2004-05 through 2008-09.

**FY 2008 Source of Funds:** Teacher Scholarship repayments and net Kentucky Lottery proceeds

## Kentucky National Guard Tuition Award Program (KNGTAP)

**Year of Implementation:** 1996-97

**Program Description:** The Kentucky National Guard Tuition Award Program provides tuition reimbursement for active Kentucky National Guard members enrolled at public and private colleges and universities, community colleges, or vocational/technical schools. Recipients must maintain all minimum standards, be eligible for all positive personnel actions, and have completed basic training or its equivalent.

The Kentucky National Guard determines and verifies the eligibility criteria for students and KHEAA disburses funds directly to the schools on behalf of students.

To apply, students must contact the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs

**Award Amount:** Up to or equal to the in-state full-time tuition rate of a public university or community college.

**Amount Disbursed:** \$18.9 million to 6,068 Guard members from 2004-05 through 2008-09.

**FY 2009 Source of Funds:** Osteopathic Medicine Scholarship revenues and net Kentucky Lottery proceeds

## Osteopathic Medicine Scholarship (OMS)

### Osteopathic Medicine Scholarship (OMS)

**Year of Implementation:** 1998-99

**Program Description:** The Osteopathic Medicine Scholarship provides tuition equalization for students who choose to attend Pikeville College School of Osteopathic Medicine. Recipients are required to render one year of qualified service for each year the scholarship is awarded. If the recipient fails to complete an eligible program of study or render qualified service as a primary care physician, the recipient must repay the scholarship plus 6 percent interest from the date of disbursement.

To apply, students must contact the Pikeville College School of Osteopathic Medicine.

**Award Amount:** Equal to the difference between the average amount charged for in-state tuition at the state medical schools and that charged at Pikeville College School of Osteopathic Medicine.

**Total Amount Disbursed:** \$4.5 million to 212 students from 2004-05 through 2008-09.

**FY 2009 Source of Funds:** Coal Severance Tax

## Minority Educator Recruitment and Retention (MERR) Scholarship

**Year of Implementation:** 1992-93

**Program Description:** The Minority Educator Recruitment and Retention (MERR) Scholarship was authorized by the Kentucky General Assembly in 1992 to address the critical shortage of minority teachers, especially in the areas of mathematics and science in the Commonwealth. The conversion scholarship/loan is an annual, competitive and renewable award that may be used for up to four academic years.

MERR provides financial assistance to minority students who are enrolled in teacher education programs and pursuing initial teacher certification at Kentucky's state-supported universities and community colleges.

Recipients are required to teach one semester in a Kentucky public or private school for each semester of award received. Those who teach in a critical subject area receive two semesters of credit for each semester of teaching service. Recipients who do not complete an eligible program of study or do not render qualified teaching service must repay the scholarship with 6 percent interest that accrues from the date of disbursement.

To apply, students must contact the financial aid office at public universities in Kentucky.

**Award Amount:** Up to \$5,000 per academic year for students attending public four-year universities; up to \$1,000 per academic year for students attending community colleges.

**Amount Disbursed:** \$6.2 million to 836 students from 2004-05 through 2008-09.

**FY 2009 Source of Funds:** General Funds

## KHEAA Work-Study Program (KWSP)

**Year of Implementation:** 1990-91

**Program Description:** The KHEAA Work-Study Program (KWSP) provides career-related work experience for eligible Kentucky residents attending approved in-state postsecondary institutions. The jobs are provided by Kentucky employers, at least 75 percent of which are in the private sector. Students must be enrolled at least half-time and be making satisfactory academic progress. Priority for jobs is given to undergraduates. KHEAA pays the schools an administrative cost allowance and reimburses employers \$2 an hour toward the wages of each student. In 2008-09, six institutions participated in KWSP, including:

- Eastern Kentucky University.
- Lindsey Wilson College.
- Murray State University.
- Southeast Community College.
- University of Kentucky.
- Western Kentucky University.

To apply, students must contact the KWSP coordinator at the school they plan to attend.

**Award Amount:** Students are paid at least the federal minimum wage. The maximum amount students may earn from KWSP is an amount equal to the total cost of education minus financial aid received from all sources.

**Amount Disbursed:** \$3.9 million to 4,703 students from 2004-05 through 2008-09.

**FY 2009 Source of Funds:** Kentucky Higher Education Student Loan Corporation revenue transfers

## Early Childhood Development Scholarship (ECDS)

**Year of Implementation:** 2000-01

**Program Description:** The Early Childhood Development Scholarship (ECDS) promotes the professional development of persons who are employed or provide training in child-care or early childhood settings. Recipients must be pursuing no more than nine credit hours in an eligible early childhood education program and be employed at least 20 hours weekly in an early childhood setting.

Those who have access to professional development funds from other education programs that receive state or federal funds are not eligible.

To apply, students must complete an online Early Childhood Development Scholarship application through Zip Access and a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

**Award Amount:** Tuition, not to exceed \$1,800 per year.

**Amount Disbursed:** \$4.2 million to 2,832 students from 2005-06 through 2008-09.

NOTE: Individual student-level data for ECDS recipients is not available on KHEAA's student aid data bases for academic years prior to 2005-06.

**FY 2009 Source of Funds:** Tobacco Settlement Funds

## Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship (BYRD)

**Year of Implementation:** 1988-89

**Program Description:** The Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship rewards academic achievement in high school or on the GED test. Applicants must either graduate from a public or private high school or receive a GED during the same academic year for which the scholarship is awarded. The scholarship provides financial aid to academically talented high school seniors and GED graduates who show promise of continued excellence in postsecondary education.

Students submit Byrd applications via Zip Access. Counselor and GED coordinators certify eligibility and nominate students. The total number of nominations per high school depends on high school enrollment. Those who receive a Byrd Scholarship may use the award at an out-of-state institution.

**Award Amount:** The maximum annual award is \$1,500 per year and is renewable for a total of four years.

**Amount Disbursed:** \$2.5 million to 732 students from 2004-05 through 2008-09.

**Source of Funds:** Federal funding

## Go Higher Grant (GHG)

**Year of Implementation:** 2007-2008.

**Program Description:** Go Higher Grants are available to adult students with financial need who are at least 24 years of age and enrolled in fewer than six credit hours at a participating Kentucky college or university. These grants are designed to introduce adults to college and encourage them to continue their education.

To be considered for a grant, students must complete a Go Higher Grant application and the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Grant applications are available at [www.kheaa.com](http://www.kheaa.com) or from adult education and learning centers located throughout Kentucky.

**Award Amount:** A one-time award of up to \$1,000 to be used during one academic year to help defray the cost of tuition and required fees. The grant also includes a \$50 per credit hour book allowance. Remaining grant from the fall semester may be used in the spring semester for any number of credit hours up to maximum award amount.

**Amount Disbursed:** \$318,276 to 326 students from 2007-08 through 2008-09.

**FY 2009 Source of Funds:** General Revenue appropriations
