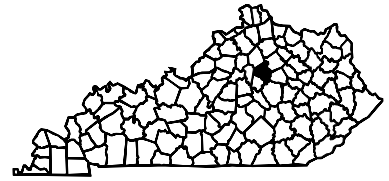

Admission requirements: Based on high school grades, ACT/SAT scores (optional) and additional information. Pre-college curriculum required for incoming freshmen.

Criteria used to determine nontraditional status: Age 25 or older or two years out of high school, military veteran, or family responsibilities

Placement/credit examinations: AP, CLEP, institutional test, IB

Application deadlines: Early Action: December 1
Regular: February 15

Students should apply by December 1 if they want to be considered for scholarships or the Honors Program.

Pre-enrollment fees and deposits:
Application for Admission: \$50 (nonrefundable)
Enrollment Deposit: \$125 enrollment deposit*; \$100 online orientation fee (OR \$125 enrollment deposit*; \$125 in-person orientation fee. Orientation guests are an additional \$35 per person)
Housing Application: \$50* (nonrefundable)
Housing Prepayment: \$150* (refundable if student does not enroll)

* Enrollment deposit is nonbinding until May 1. Housing application and prepayment are nonbinding until June 1. If a deadline falls on a weekend, it is extended until 11:59 p.m. ET the following Monday.
