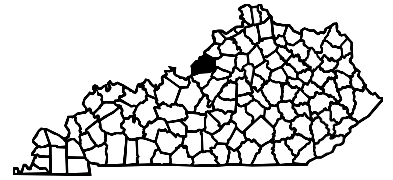

Admission requirements: Strong high school grades and a pre-college high school curriculum. ACT and SAT optional but may be required for competitive scholarships.

Criteria used to determine nontraditional status: Age 25 or older and a high school graduate or GED recipient for adult students

Placement/credit examinations: AP, CLEP, institutional test/ placement tests, IB, TOEFL, DSST

Application deadlines: December 15 for mentored and competitive scholarships, Honors Program and guaranteed entrance programs; May 1 for freshman general admission

Scholarship deadlines for adult, community college and non-resident transfers vary. Visit <http://louisville.edu/admissions/apply/transfer/> for deadlines. Transfer students should apply at least 6 weeks before start of term.

Pre-enrollment fees and deposits:

Application for admission: \$25 (nonrefundable; applied to tuition); none if approved for fee waiver
Enrollment deposit: \$100 (nonrefundable; applied to tuition)
Housing application fee: \$100; \$50 if approved for fee waiver
