KHEAA helps Kentuckians pay for higher education

Kentuckians seeking help to pay for college or technical training can take advantage of student aid programs administered by the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA).

“Every Kentuckian should be able to pursue higher education or technical training after high school, without financial barriers holding them back,” Gov. Andy Beshear said. “I encourage students to take advantage of KHEAA’s financial aid programs that make college and vocational classes possible for so many of our students.”

KHEAA programs include the:

- **Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship.** KEES lets high school students earn money by getting good grades in school and doing well on the ACT or SAT.
- **College Access Program Grant.** CAP awards help financially needy students pay for classes at Kentucky’s public and private two- and four-year colleges.
- **Kentucky Tuition Grant.** Students enrolled full time in an associate’s or bachelor’s degree program at the state’s private colleges may be eligible for a KTG award.
- **Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship.** The WRKS program helps Kentuckians who have not yet earned an associate’s degree afford an industry-recognized certificate, diploma or AAS degree.
