KHEAA chosen for Postsecondary Pathways Project

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Aug. 29, 2022) — The Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority has been selected to work with the National College Attainment Network (NCAN) on the Postsecondary Pathways Project.

“As a member of the project, KHEAA will help NCAN share information about postsecondary planning with K–12 contacts in Kentucky,” Lt. Gov. Jacqueline Coleman said. “KHEAA will also share resources with NCAN that could be adapted for use in other states and will partner with them on professional development opportunities for school personnel and college access providers in Kentucky and nationwide.”

NCAN is leading the Postsecondary Pathways Project, which is being funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to help Black and Latino students and students experiencing poverty overcome obstacles to getting an education and beginning a career. Kentucky is one of 15 states collaborating with NCAN to develop, refine and advance a student-centered support model, and to identify and promote high-leverage activities states can take on if they want to improve their students’ educational attainment levels.
